Dear Messrs. Doby and Garnsey,

Thank you for your follow-up letter. I believe my first letter did clearly outline our rationale for why we feel it is important and necessary to allow the community to participate in visioning for the future of the Park Hill Golf Course, so I will not reiterate that here.

However, to answer your question about the boundaries of the planning area, the planning area will extend beyond the property line for the golf course. While the exact boundary has not yet been determined since we are still very early in this process, it will include the connections to surrounding neighborhoods.

Regarding your questions concerning the conservation easement, any proposal to amend the easement would require approval by Denver City Council. Any other implications regarding the easement could only be assessed in light of the specific outcome of the community planning process. In the meantime, our role is to take the time to hear from the neighbors who are most impacted by this property, including but not limited to Save Open Space Denver. A planning process will allow us to do that.

As previously stated, we share your commitment to preserving and creating open space in Denver and we believe that thoughtful, well-designed public open space here could be beneficial to the surrounding neighborhoods. We will reach out again when we are further into this community process.
